

## **100 Point Identifier Check**

The National Vetting (Children and Vulnerable Persons) Act 2012 makes it a legal requirement to vet those involved in work or activity, where they will have regular access to or contact with children or vulnerable adults.

This information sheet has been developed to verify the identity of those applying to be Garda Vetted as required by the Act. When conducting Garda Vetting, volunteers or workers are required to present identification totaling 100 points to ensure they are checking the correct person. At least one form of photographic evidence must be gathered.
